SUBJECT: Official Ballot Statement for the General Election on November 3, 2026

The Secretary of State, in carrying out the duties of the office, shall issue detailed directives necessary to maintain uniformity in the application, operation, and interpretation of Oregon election laws.¹

The information provided here is an official directive of the Secretary of State.

Enclosed and made part of this directive is the Official Ballot Statement required by [ORS 254.085](#), which serves as a guide for preparing the county's ballot. The state Official Ballot Statement consists of Partisan and Nonpartisan Candidates.

A list of [open offices](#) for the November 3, 2026, General Election is also enclosed for reference.

This directive provides instructions for processing the Official Ballot Statement for the 2026 General Election.

The instructions address the following:

Consistent with the instructions, the provisions of [ORS 254.108](#), [254.125](#), [254.135](#), [254.145](#), [254.155](#), [254.195](#), and [260.675](#) should be reviewed prior to preparing the county's official ballot.

The Secretary of State directs the following:

BALLOT LABEL STYLE

The official General Election Ballot shall be styled “Official Ballot” and shall state the name of your county and the date of the election. See [ORS 254.135](#) for further requirements.

BALLOT SPECIFICATIONS

All official General Election ballots shall be printed in black ink on good-quality material, as required by [ORS 254.195\(1\)](#).

Ballots shall be printed on white paper.

BALLOT ARRANGEMENT

The offices shall be arranged in the sequence shown on the enclosed Official Ballot Statement. Offices are listed in the following order:

1. Federal Office

- US Senator
- US Representative

2. State Office

- Governor

3. Legislative Office

- State Senator
- State Representative

4. County Office – if partisan

5. City Office – if partisan

6. Nonpartisan Office – the sequence of all nonpartisan offices shall be as follows:

a. State Office

- None at this election

b. State Judicial Office

Contested races appear before uncontested races for the same office type.

[ORS 254.125\(2\)\(a\)](#).

- Contested Circuit Court positions
- Uncontested Circuit Court positions

c. District Attorney

d. Nonpartisan County Offices

- County Assessor
- County Clerk
- County Surveyor
- County Treasurer
- Sheriff
- County Commissioner, if nonpartisan
- County Judge
- Justice of the Peace

Note: County offices may vary by county.

e. Nonpartisan City Offices

f. Special District Offices – if any

7. Ranked Choice Voting Contests

Note: Election officials may adjust the placement of contests to accommodate ballot design or administrative needs. Ranked Choice Voting contests may appear on a separate ballot card or in an alternate location on the ballot.

Any adjustment must preserve the hierarchy of offices in this directive. A contest may not appear above the level of office to which it belongs. Lower-level contests cannot be placed above higher-level offices. For example, local district contests may not appear above statewide or congressional offices.

8. Measures

- State (None at this election)
- County
- City
- Multi-County Special District
- Single County Special District

If the ballot arrangement described above would create administrative or printing difficulties, please contact this office for further guidance.

BALLOT MEASURE FORMATTING

There are no statewide measures on the November 3, 2026, General Election ballot.

The Secretary of State requires the following formatting for statewide ballot measures to promote consistency and readability for voters: Ballot measure headers and the ballot title captions should be printed in boldface, mixed-case type rather than in all uppercase. Mixed case means that the first letter of a phrase or sentence, and only certain words within a sentence, may be uppercase, with the remaining letters lowercase. This requirement does not apply to local ballot measures. However, the Secretary of State encourages consistent formatting for local measures to promote readability for the voters.

NUMBERING SYSTEM

The number assigned to each local (county, city, and district) measure must be preceded by your unique county prefix number (i.e., Baker County is number 1, Benton is number 2, and so forth, numbered consecutively in alphabetical order until Yamhill County, which is number 36). [ORS 254.108\(1\)](#).

If a district or city is located in more than one county, the County Election Official who is the filing officer shall immediately certify the district or city measure and number to the County Election Official of any other county in which the district or city is located. The same measure number shall be used in all counties in which the election is conducted for that measure. [ORS 254.108\(2\)](#).

RANDOM ORDERING OF CANDIDATE NAMES

The names of the candidates shall be ordered as provided for in [ORS 254.155](#). On August 27, 2026, this office sent a memo to all County Election Officials giving the random ordering of the letters of the alphabet for candidates on the ballot for the November 3, 2026, General Election.

The random order of the alphabet in which candidates' names will appear on the ballot for the November 3, 2026, General Election is as follows:

For candidates whose last names begin with the same letter(s) of the alphabet, whose surnames are identical, or whose first and last names are identical, follow the procedure contained in [OAR 165-010-0090](#).

[ORS 254.135\(3\)\(F\)\(e\)](#) requires that, if two or more candidates for the same office have the same first and last name, the location of their places of residence shall be printed with their names to distinguish one from another.

The Official Ballot Statement for federal and state candidates has been prepared by the Secretary of State using the random sequence.

PRINTING CANDIDATE NAMES

The names of candidates shall be printed on the county's official ballot as indicated in the Official Ballot Statement.

[ORS 249.031](#) allows a candidate to use the name by which the candidate is commonly known.

The names of candidates and candidate office titles must be in **boldface and mixed-case type** rather than in all uppercase, for the purpose of better readability. Mixed case means the first letters of these names shall be uppercase with the rest lowercase (unless within the name an uppercase letter is specified by the candidate, such as "McVan").

[ORS 254.145\(2\)](#) provides that no title or designation may be included in the candidate's name (such as Dr, Mr, PhD, Senior Vice President, etc.). A suffix (such as Jr, Sr, III, IV, etc.) is allowable if it is part of the name by which the candidate is commonly known.

Additionally, **candidate names must not contain any punctuation, with the exception of accent marks, hyphens, apostrophes, parentheses, and commas**. Accent marks, hyphens, and apostrophes may be used when they are part of the standard spelling of a candidate's legal name or the name by which the candidate is commonly known. Parentheses may be used to include a nickname in connection with a candidate's full name, consistent with [ORS 249.031](#). Commas are allowed preceding a suffix but are not required.

Other punctuation marks, including but not limited to exclamation points, quotation marks, symbols, or periods, are not permitted in candidate names on the ballot.

Note: If no candidate has filed for an office, the ballot must include "No Candidate Filed."

MULTIPLE PARTY NOMINATIONS

Candidates may be nominated by multiple political parties. Up to three parties may be listed after a candidate's name, as indicated in the Official Ballot Statement. If the candidate was nominated by the party they are a member of, that party will be listed first, followed by two or fewer additional parties in alphabetical order or as specified by the candidate. If individual electors or an assembly of electors nominate a nonaffiliated candidate, "nonaffiliated" will be listed first, followed by two or fewer additional parties in alphabetical order or as specified by the candidate. [ORS 254.135\(3\)](#).

JUDICIAL CANDIDATES "INCUMBENT" DESIGNATION

The information for state candidates for Supreme Court, Court of Appeals, Tax Court, and Circuit Court positions shall include a designation of "Incumbent" for each candidate who is the regularly elected or appointed judge of the court to which the candidate seeks election. [ORS 254.125\(2\)\(b\)](#). The Official Ballot Statement provides this designation. Please note that justices of the peace, county judges, and municipal court judges do not have the "Incumbent" designation.

COUNTY NONPARTISAN CANDIDATES

Review [ORS 249.091](#) to determine whether county nonpartisan candidates (Sheriff, County Treasurer, or County Clerk) or candidates seeking to fill a vacancy in a nonpartisan office are required to be listed on the General Election ballot.

LINES FOR CANDIDATE WRITE-IN VOTES

[ORS 254.145\(3\)](#) provides for the write-in of names in the appropriate place on the ballot. Allow one blank line for each position to be filled. Example: "Vote for Three. " In this case, you will provide three blank lines following the list of candidates for that office. Blank lines shall not be numbered, except for the precinct committeeperson's office.

Offices that have been certified as "No Candidate Filed" must still appear on the ballot with the appropriate number of write-in lines. "No Candidate Filed" may appear on the line where the candidate's name would otherwise appear.
