RE: Forest Stocking Survey

Dear Staff,

This letter provides information regarding the results of a stocking survey conducted on a tract of land legally described as Township 18 South, Range 2 West, in Section 11 Tax Lot 200. The parcel is located just southeast of Springfield, Oregon off Brand S Road. The tract is approximately 19.04 acres.

The survey revealed that the property contains 5.80 acres of native grasses and forbs some of which were converted from invasive species primarily Himalaya blackberry and some scotch broom; .34 acres of Oregon white oak forest (40-60 years of age) with an understory of grass prairie, poison oak or Himalaya blackberry; .5 acres of Douglas-fir forest 30 years of age; 12.40 acres of mix conifer and hardwood primarily ponderosa pine and Douglas-fir forest (25-30 years of age) with a scattering of Incense cedar, bigleaf maple and Oregon white oak; and the remaining .5 acres are in private roadway. The entire parcel meets the requirements of the Oregon Forest Practices Act for reforestation.
